IT IS FINISHED, YOU ARE FORGIVEN

- The Hebrew word *Tetelestai* is *Mashelem* in Aramaic. It means the debt is paid in full.
- God has forgiven us through the finished work of our Lord Jesus Christ on the cross.
- *Tayo ay pinatawad na ng lubos!*
- We don't go to heaven because we are godly. We go to heaven because God is just and the justifier of all of us. He made Jesus pay for all our sins. It's already paid! *Tetelestai!*
- *Bawat pagkakasala, walang pinalusot. Lahat ng kasalanan ay kailangang bayaran.* Praise be to God *na hindi tayo ang pinagbayad. Si Hesus ang nagbayad ng lahat!*
- *Bayad na ang kasalanan, ginawa ka pang New Creation!*
- Everything was given to us already. We need to be aware of what comes with being a New Creation in Christ. Know the Full Package.
- *Lahat ay isinama na, ibinigay na ng Panginoon.* He has supplied us with all good things. All supplied.
- **2 Peter 1:5-7 TPT**
- You can only give or add what you already have. *Lahat 'yan ay nasa 'yo na.*
- The only reason you can add this is because they have already been given to you. Full package with manual and now with teacher and teaching, everything has been given to you, believer.
- **2 Peter 1:8 TPT** – *Malalim ang pagkakatanim at Diyos mismo ang nagtanim ng mga ito sa 'yo* in abundant supply.
- **2 Peter 1:9 TPT** – If one cannot see it, he is blind (blind *lang, hindi ibig sabihin na wala*). *Kaya imulat mo ang iyong mga mata na nasa 'yo na ang lahat.*
- **2 Peter 1:10 TPT** – Be eager to confirm. Declare: “I have it all.”
- Salvation is all inclusive. God has claimed you as His own – *na-claim ka na, sa Panginoon ka na.*
- **2 Peter 1:11 TPT** – God choreographs your triumphant entrance.
- If you are assured of your salvation *na* forgiven and accepted *ka na*, be also assured that God is preparing your grand entrance to the kingdom.
- **2 Peter 1:9** – “For he who lacks these things is shortsighted, even to blindness, and has forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins.” *Ang punu't dulo ng lack of these things is not because you lack it. Nasa 'yo na, blind ka lang or nakapikit ka lang or shortsighted ka lang.*
- Be aware you have all these. *Dapat alam mo na meron ka ng mga ito:*
 - 1. All things given that pertain to life and godliness.
 - 2. Exceedingly great and precious promises – *lahat ng pangako ng Diyos ay Yes and Amen!*
 - 3. The virtues that are deeply planted in you: Faith, goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, brotherly kindness and love.
- Because God loves you, you are never loveless. God loves you best. *Mahal na mahal ka ng Diyos!* Be eager to be aware.
- If you are not aware of these things, you are blind/eyes are closed and short-sighted, and you have forgotten you are cleansed from sins.
- Be farsighted – as far as eternity and heaven. Set your mind on things above, on eternal things. Be farsighted. See what God has given you already through His Son, Jesus Christ.
- It is a tragedy if you cannot see what you already have. Don't let this happen to you. How? By hearing and hearing the Word of God.

- Another thing mentioned by Peter that stops us from experiencing all that God has given us is forgetting we are cleansed or forgiven.
- Declare: “I am forgiven of all sins.”
- You have been made innocent. As far as God is concerned, you are like Jesus – innocent, righteous, worthy of all blessings.
- Christian life can also be dangerous if we do not see what’s in front of us. Some believers condemn themselves; others even commit suicide. *Nakita mo lang ang ginawa mo pero hindi mo nakita ang ginawa ni Kristo.*
- If you can’t forgive others, you can’t forgive others also. If you condemn yourself, you will condemn others too.
- The key is to see yourself as righteous as Jesus is righteous now.
- **2 Corinthians 5:17-19** – not condemnation but reconciliation.
- The solution to this sort of blindness is to open our eyes by hearing and hearing the Word of Christ and be open to the realities of our new life in Christ.
- Be reminded of this: The gospel of grace declares you are eternally and completely forgiven.
 - **1 John 2:12** – Your sins are forgiven you for His name’s sake.
 - **1 John 1:7** – You have been cleansed from all sin.
 - **John 1:29** – All sin – past, present, and future – were carried away by the Lamb of God.
 - **1 John 2:2** – Jesus is the propitiation for our sins (the sacrifice that satisfies).
 - **Isaiah 1:18** – If you wish to grow in grace, you need to believe that your old sins are gone. That is being under grace. In Christ, you are as white as snow.
 - **1 Peter 2:9-10** – You are no longer a sinner but a saint. Declare: “I’m a royal priesthood, chosen by God.”
 - **Acts 13:38-39** – Everyone who believes is justified (just as if I never sinned).
 - **Ephesians 1:7** – We have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.
 - **Colossians 2:13** – Having forgiven us all trespasses.
- These many verses are needful. **2 Peter 1:12** – “For this reason I will not be negligent to remind you always of these things, though you know and are established in the present truth.”
- These reminders are very important: That you are forever forgiven by the perfect sacrifice of our Lord Jesus Christ on the cross.
- Declare: “*Tetelestai!* It is finished! Jesus already paid my debt!”

Jesus paid for all our sins.

It’s already paid! Tetelestai!

As a New Creation, be aware you have all things given that pertain to life and godliness.
